NOTES RELATING TO ELECTION OF SENATE MEMBERS

QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP OF CONVOCATION (SECTION 17(1) OF THE *UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT 1911*):

Select one of the following criteria:

- (a) members and past members of the Senate;
- (b) graduates of the University;
- (c) persons not referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) who were members of Convocation immediately before the coming into operation of the *Universities Legislation Amendment Act 2016* section 152;
- (d) persons who the Senate may, from time to time, admit to be members of Convocation.

PERSONS DISQUALIFIED FROM BEING A CONVOCATION-ELECTED SENATE MEMBER:

- (a) persons not of the full age of 21 years; or
- (b) is, according to the *Interpretation Act 1984* section 13D, a bankrupt or a person whose affairs are under insolvency laws; or
- (c) is removed from office by the Senate under section 11A; or
- (d) is, or becomes, disqualified from managing corporations under the *Corporations Act 2001 (Commonwealth)* Part 2D.6; or
- (e) has been convicted of an offence and sentenced to a term of imprisonment, unless the person has been pardoned or has completed the term of imprisonment; or
- (f) ceases to hold the qualification required to be held by the person for appointment as a member of the Senate; or
- (g) is a person in respect of whom an administration order is in force under the *Guardianship and Administration Act 1990* Part 6; or
- (h) are of unsound mind or are persons whose person or estate is liable to be dealt with in any way under the law relating to mental health; or
- (i) are not members of Convocation; or
- (j) a person who is a member of the staff of the University.

CANDIDATE BIOGRAPHIES:

Candidates may supply a biography to support their candidacy. The biography should be submitted headed by the candidate's Surname and First name (*not part of 250 word biography*) only (as stated by the candidate on the nomination form). Honorifics etc. can be included in the text the candidate submits.

As provided for in Clause 24 of Statute No. 12:

- 24.(1) A person seeking election may deliver, with the nomination referred to in Clause 5, a biography not exceeding 250 words in length, containing all or any of the following particulars of that person:
- (a) degree or degrees, date of graduation and other professional qualifications;
 - (b) profession or position;
 - (c) details of work on bodies connected or associated with the University;
 - (d) prizes won, publications issued and research done;
 - (e) service whether in war or peace to the community or any section of it and positions held in connection with that service;
 - (f) such other particulars as the candidate may consider appropriate.
- (2) If an election is required, the biography of each candidate for election must be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor and the Warden (unless the Warden is seeking election), who may delete any matter which they or he or she (as the case may be) consider to be offensive or untrue.
- (3) Before exercising the power to delete any matter from a biography the Vice-Chancellor or Warden must, if possible, consult the candidate concerned.
- (4) A copy of the approved biography of each person seeking election showing his or her name and address and the names of the proposer and seconder referred to in Clause 5(2) must be posted with the ballot papers.

PLEASE NOTE THAT:

A recent photograph (head and shoulders) may be supplied with the biography.

The candidate may include in the biography an email address and/or contact phone number to enable voters to contact them to discuss their candidacy.
